



## I have Wind and/or hail damage to my home...What do I do now?

1. Contact your insurance agent to notify them of loss or damage and schedule an assessment.
2. It is suggested that you start contacting licensed contractors for bids on the work. (3 is recommended)
  - a. If contractor estimate exceeds insurance amounts, contact your insurance adjuster to make a supplemental claim for the difference.
  - b. Insure that the insurance company is aware of all damages related to the event (fences, siding, etc.)

3. If you as the homeowner want to perform the work yourself, you have that right provided, you OWN THE HOME, RESIDE IN THE HOME AND ARE PERFORMING THE WORK YOURSELF. You as the homeowner cannot make repairs that require a permit on a secondary property. Do **NOT** pull the permit for your contractor.

5. Permits can be purchased through various methods depending on the scope. Most permits that will be purchased due to the wind or hail can be done on our website or over the phone by calling 719-327-2880. We are also open from 7:30-4:15 Monday-Friday.
